# Koala mask

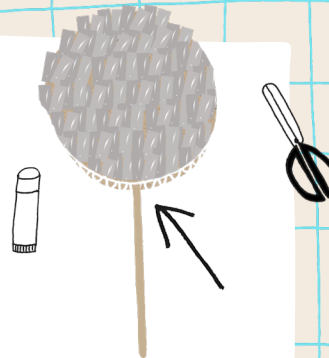
### Things you need:

1. Piece of corrugated cardboard (roughly 30 x 60cm)
2. A4 white paper (3 sheets)
3. White tissue paper
4. Grey crayon
5. Black crayon
6. Piece of black bin liner (14cm x 10cm)
7. Wooden stick or stirrer
8. Glue
9. Scissors (and help from a grown-up)
10. Dinner plate, side plate



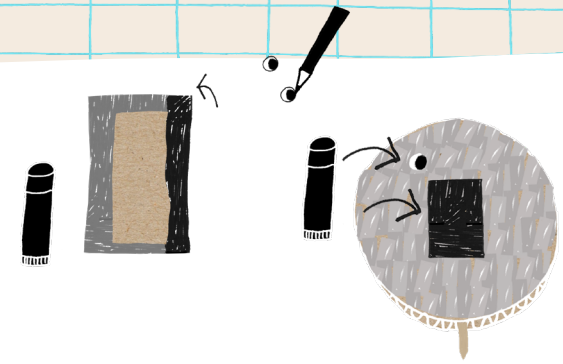
**1.** Using a dinner plate to draw around, mark a circle on the corrugated cardboard for the head, then cut it out.

**2.** Colour in some paper with a grey crayon and cut two side-plate-sized circles from it for the ears. Cut the rest of the grey paper into pieces roughly 1cm x 3cm.



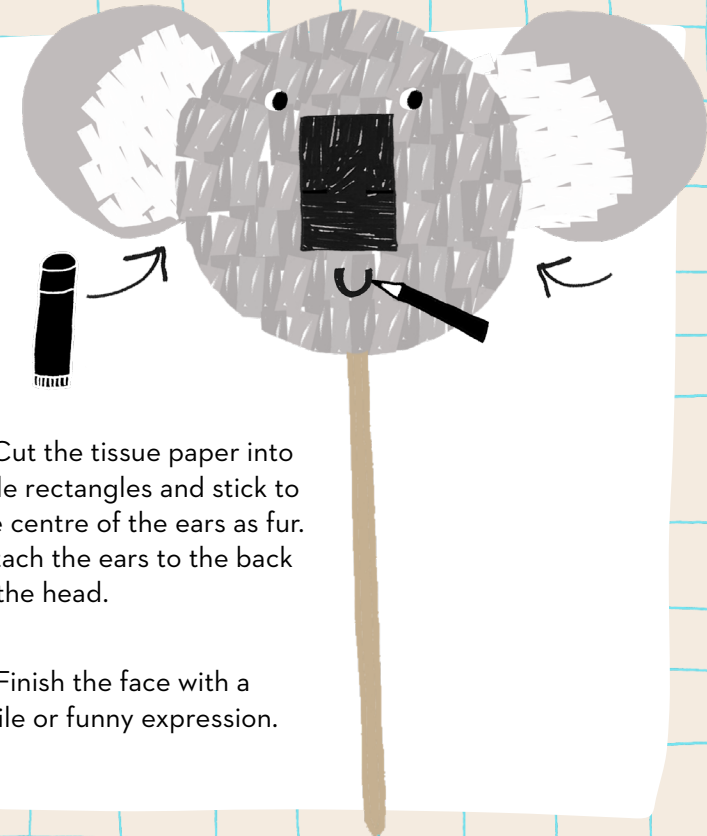
**3.** Cover the head all over with pieces of grey paper to create a fur effect. Trim around the edge with scissors.

**4.** Slot one end of the wooden stick inside the corrugated card as shown.



**5.** Cut a rectangle (roughly 10cm x 6cm) from the corrugated cardboard. Cover in black bin liner and stick onto the face, neat side up.

**6.** Cut two circles of white paper the size of a 1p coin. Add a black dot to the middle of each and glue to the face.



**7.** Cut the tissue paper into little rectangles and stick to the centre of the ears as fur. Attach the ears to the back of the head.

**8.** Finish the face with a smile or funny expression.

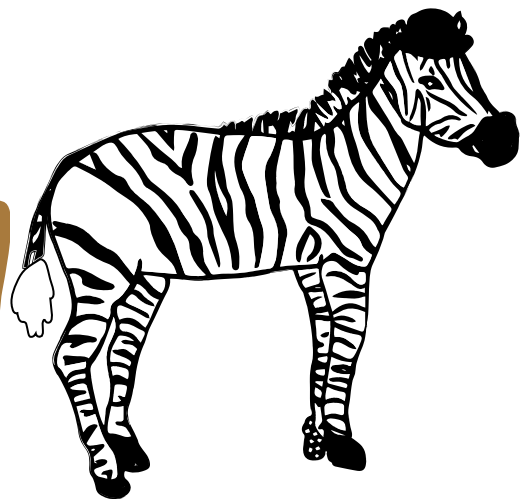
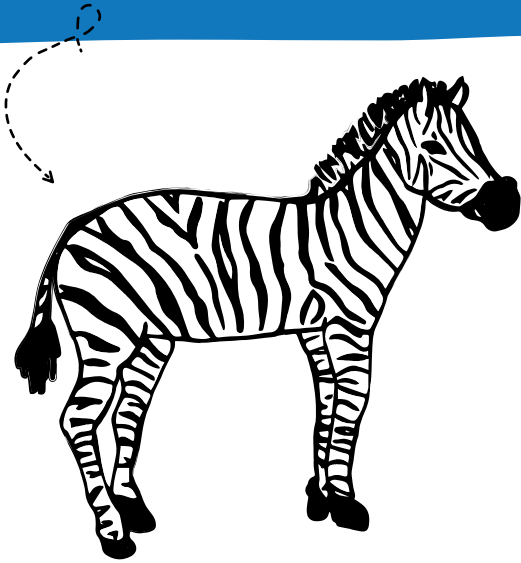

# Travelling toucan

### Things you need:

1. 2 loo roll tubes
2. Scissors (and help from a grown-up)
3. Pens and paints for decorating

#### Did you know?

A toucan's beak is about 20cm long - and they have an equally long tongue to match.

**1.** Cut one roll down the centre and open it out flat. Cut a large beak shape.



**2.** Cut a slit halfway up the wider end of the beak.



**3.** On the second roll, cut a slit about 2cm deep at the top of what will be the front of the toucan. (This is for the beak to slot into later.)



**4.** Cut a semi-circle out of the base at the front of the roll. Either side of the top of the semi-circle, cut four 1cm slits very close together for the claws, as shown. Tuck in or trim off the flap between the claws, then curl the claws around a pencil to make them stick out.



**5.** Cut three longer slits into the base at the back of the roll to make tail feathers. Bend them back gently so they stick out.



**6.** Cut three small slits at the top of the back of the roll to make head feathers. Bend them back gently so they stick out.

**7.** Use your pens and paints to decorate as shown before slotting the beak into place.

**8.** Fly off somewhere exotic with your toucan.

# Giant gallivanting giraffe

## Things you need:

1. Large corrugated cardboard rectangle (ideally 1m x 30cm)
2. Smaller corrugated cardboard rectangle (roughly 30cm x 15cm)
3. A4 paper or card (4 - 5 sheets)
4. Brown crayon
5. Black crayon
6. Glue
7. Scissors (and help from a grown-up)

1. Colour your sheets of paper or card brown all over.

2. Cut two horns (roughly 6cm x 3cm) and two ears (ovals roughly 12cm x 6cm).

3. Cut out the large and small rectangle, giving them both slightly rounded edges. These will be the body and head of the giraffe.

4. Leaving two sheets spare, cut out 10 - 12 rough rectangular shapes from the coloured-in brown paper and stick all over the body and head to make a giraffe pattern.

5. Cut the remaining brown paper into rough squares and cut slits into each as shown to create the mane.



6. Draw black eyes and nostrils onto the face and stick the ears and horns to the back of the head.

7. Stick the head to the body at an angle, as shown.

8. Stick the mane down one side of the body piece so it sticks out.

9. Take your giant giraffe on a giant adventure.
